



HEALTH & SAFETY POLICY STATEMENT

New Deer Agricultural Association accepts its responsibility for providing and maintaining, so far as is reasonably practicable, at all times during the setting up and running of the New Deer Show, an environment which is both safe and healthy for all. To this end New Deer Agricultural Association will take all steps within its powers to meet its responsibilities under The Health and Safety at Work etc Act 1974 and all other legal requirements for Health and Safety and actively seeks the full and understanding co-operation of all persons involved in the Show for their commitment to the same. New Deer Agricultural Association will annually review this policy as required by the Health and Safety at Work etc Act 1974.

ASSOCIATION RULES

Please read the following Association Rules carefully.

1. The Exhibitors, Stand Holders, Caterers and Public are at their own risk, the Association undertaking no responsibility for any accident, loss or damage to person or property that may occur at the Show or in transit.
2. All Exhibitors, Stand Holders, Caterers and Public must co-operate with the organisers in compliance with Health and Safety Environmental Regulations and everything practicable must be done to ensure the health, safety and welfare of everyone attending.
3. Accommodation will be given in the Showpark to merchants for the exhibition or sale of goods approved by the Committee, at a charge to be agreed.
4. No change can be made in these Rules except by regular meeting of Executive Committee.
5. The Annual General Meeting will be held in November where accounts will be examined and officials elected for the next year.
6. New Deer Agricultural Association cannot be held responsible for cancellations due to severe weather.

LIVESTOCK SECTIONS

7. Membership £25.00. Entries from Members Only.
8. First Aid Levy: £1 per Exhibitor in the Livestock Classes
9. Members entering stock MUST INCLUDE THE MEMBERSHIP MONEY WITH THE APPROPRIATE ENTRY FEES. Those wishing to retain their membership, but who cannot or will not be at the Show should send their money within 10 days of the Show date to the Secretary.
10. A Child under the age of 16 can enter ONE animal ONLY under the Membership of his/her parent or guardian for the entry fee only. (Restricted to one child per household).
11. Any entries not paid prior to printing of catalogue may not appear in catalogue on show day.
12. Entry Money for all Stock entered in Catalogue must be paid, regardless of non-appearance at Show.
13. Late Horse entries will be taken only until Wednesday prior to show, however, entrants will not be in the catalogue and an additional charge of £10 will be incurred. No Horse entries will be accepted on the day of the Show. NO SHEEP OR CATTLE LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED (WHETHER RECEIVED BY LATE MAIL OR TELEPHONE) AFTER THE CATALOGUE DOCUMENTATION AND ENTRIES HAVE BEEN FORWARDED TO THE PRINTERS. Any postal entries so received will be returned to the sender by First-Class Post. Any cheques returned by our Bank as unpaid will incur an additional charge of £20 to cover administrative costs.
14. All stock shown at the Exhibitors own risk
15. All Exhibitors must be covered by their own public liability insurance and all incidents reported to the section convenor. All stock should be adequately insured.
16. All cattle entered must comply with current SGRPID regulations and ear tagged accordingly. Cattle movements must be notified to ScotEID. A MEMBER OF THE SHOW COMMITTEE WILL UPDATE YOUR

ON AND OFF MOVEMENT. For each animal taken to the Showground you must have a single page passport (CPP52).

17. All cattle (including calves) coming to the show must come from a herd that is fully accredited free of BVD or they must all be individually tested free of virus (antigen) whether or not they have been vaccinated, in accordance with CHECHS rules (www.checs.co.uk).
18. Age of Cattle to be reckoned from Show Date, and to be accounted one year old at the second show following, and so on. One-year-old must not show hard teeth.
19. Cows to be shown must be in Calf or in Milk.
20. All exhibitors entering the Parade with a bull ANY age must adhere to the LEGAL age requirement of exhibitor leading the animal. Leaders must be over 16 and under 65 years of age. All stock must remain on the showground until after the parade.
21. All Cross Cattle will be penned.
22. No warble infected cattle allowed.
23. All Carcase cattle must be Farm Assured.
24. All Sheep entered must comply with current SGRPID regulations and ear tagged accordingly. Sheep movements must be notified to SAMU within 3 days of returning home. Movement documents should include movements to and from New Deer Show, CPH No. 66/030/8004. Movement documents should not be signed by or surrendered to show organisers.
25. Ewes must have had a Lamb between 1st December and date of Show.
26. MV/CAE Accreditation Scheme. Exhibitors must ensure correct certificate of status is taken along to the show (current valid SAC Scheme form or Health Status Report, signed, dated with destination and ear numbers of animals completed in full by exhibitor). Paperwork must be ready for inspection by sheep convenors on approach to the sheep penning areas. Accredited animals will not be permitted to unload without it.
27. Separate unloading and re-loading points for MV/CAE Accredited and Non-Accredited stock will be available in the Showfield. MV/CAE Accredited and Non-Accredited stock must not come into contact at any time during the Show.
28. All Carcase lambs must be Farm Assured.
29. The Stock must, at date of entry, be bona fide the property of the member in whose name entered.
30. The Association retains the right to split classes if so required.
31. All animals competing in Pure Bred Classes must be entered or eligible for entry in their respective Herd Books.
32. Competitors are required to see to the placing of their stock before the Judges for the various prizes for which they intend to compete. The Committee will not be responsible if the stock is not so placed at the proper time. No one will be allowed inside the Judging Ring at the time of Judging except the Committee in charge, and those in charge of the animals being shown.
33. A Reserve Animal will be chosen for every Special Prize, so that in the case of Any Prize Animal being found unconfirming to the regulations, the next in merit shall take the premier place.
34. Objections must be lodged with the Secretary in writing no later than 1pm on the day of the show. All complaints must include a deposit of £25 which shall be forfeited to the Association if the protest is dismissed. The committee would then meet to consider any protests and have the power to all disputes. Their decision will be final against which there will be no appeal.
35. Only Association Prizes will be counted in a Most Successful Competition. 3 for a First, 2 for a Second, 1 for a Third.
36. Although the Special Prize List is believed to be in order, those shown in Catalogue will be available for Competition.
37. The Transport of Animals (Cleansing and Disinfection) (Scotland) Regulations 2005 applies to vehicles taking animals to and from the show. It is the responsibility of exhibitors to ensure that all vehicles bearing stock into the showground have been disinfected. There will not be any disinfecting facilities at the showground.

38. All stock must be in the showground by 8.00am and are not to be removed until after 2.30pm. No vehicles to be moved until after the parade.

39. All Horses must be in Parade or any prize money will be forfeited.
40. In the event of new Animal Health Legislation being enacted between the date of preparation of this Schedule and the date of the Show, Exhibitors will be expected to abide by any new conditions of that legislation.
41. All Trophies to be returned to the Secretary on Show Day or no later than 31st July.
42. No refunds will be given.
43. All exhibitors should read NDAA Risk Assessments and Health and Safety Policy – these are available to read in the office.

INDUSTRIAL SECTION

44. The exhibition is open to all comers.
45. THE JUDGES DECISION SHALL BE FINAL AND BINDING.
46. All exhibits must be bone fide work of the exhibitor in whose name the entry is made and must have been worked in the last 12 months.
47. Each article for the competition must have the exhibitors name and contact details printed in a sealed envelope, securely attached. Section and class number only to be written on the envelope, unless otherwise stated.
48. Sections 6 and 7 (all classes), Age and/or Primary year should be written on the outside of the envelope.
49. An entry fee of 30p per exhibit, to be paid at the door of the marquee, with the exception of Section 7 (children under 12) which is free.
50. Exhibitors are allowed TWO entries in each Class in Section 8 (horticulture) and Section 1 (flowers and foliage). All other sections are limited to ONE entry per Class.
51. Knitted articles must be shown unwashed. Sewn articles may be washed.
52. No vases are supplied for Section 9, classes 20-34.
53. Every care will be taken of the exhibits, but Members of the Committee do not hold themselves responsible for any loss or damage.
54. Exhibits will be received in the marquee between 8am and 10am on SATURDAY of the show.
55. **NO EXHIBITS TO BE LIFTED FROM THE TABLES BEFORE 3.30PM BUT MUST BE COLLECTED BEFORE 4PM.** No exhibit to be removed by the stewards before 4pm. Please ensure you ONLY remove your own exhibits on Sunday 19th July 2026 of the show.
56. Any food item remaining after 4pm on Sunday 19th July 2026 will be disposed of appropriately.
57. Two prizes will be given in each Class as shown in a Section, a third will be awarded where justified by number of entries and merit.
58. In points competitions a first prize shall count for 3 points, a second prize 2 points and a third prize 1 point.
59. Prize money will be paid in the Industrial tent on SATURDAY and SUNDAY between 2 and 4pm. Any uncollected prize money will be returned to the Secretary's Office on Sunday.
60. Any joint trophy winners should arrange to share the time for the trophy following the presentation at the prize giving.

VINTAGE & CLASSIC CARS SECTION

61. ALL DRIVERS MUST HAVE A VALID DRIVING LICENCE. No person without a valid driving licence shall drive a vehicle within the Showfield.
62. No passengers permitted unless the vehicle has a designated passenger seat.
63. All Exhibitors must provide a valid Certificate of Motor Insurance for their vehicles or a Public Liability Insurance Certificate for any stationery engines.
64. Exhibits will only be accepted from exhibitors who have returned completed entry forms along with the completed risk assessment (only one Risk Assessment required for an entry, not per vehicle) and relevant insurance certification for each vehicle.

65. One pass admits one vehicle and driver. Note that the pass does not include additional passengers in the vehicle. Any additional passengers will have to pay the show day admit fee.
66. Entry to the show ground with a vehicle requires an official ADMIT pass (issued in advance). No access will be granted without prior entry and a valid ADMIT pass. All exhibits must be on site and stationary by 10.00am on Sunday 19th July 2026. Engines that are running must be supervised at all times by a responsible adult and never be left unattended.
67. JUDGING WILL COMMENCE AT 11am – JUDGE MAY NOT MAKE THEMSELVES KNOWN TO EXHIBITORS.
68. Depending on the amount of entries, only prize winners may be asked to parade in the main ring.

VINTAGE TRACTOR SECTION

69. ALL DRIVERS MUST HAVE A VALID DRIVING LICENCE. No person without a valid driving licence shall drive a vehicle within the Showfield.
70. Only passengers over the age of 13 shall ride on vehicles and only on those with manufacturers provided passenger seating.
71. Please apply with all rules and no unnecessary moving of vehicles until authorised.
72. All Exhibitors must provide a valid Certificate of Motor Insurance for their vehicles or a Public Liability Insurance Certificate for any stationery engines.
73. Entry passes will be issued on arrival at the showground. No passes will be issued prior to show day.
74. One entry pass admits one vehicle and driver. Any additional passengers will have to pay the show day admit fee.
75. All exhibits must be on site and stationery by 10.00am on Sunday. Engines that are running must be supervised at all times by a responsible adult and never be left unattended.

TRACTOR FEST SECTION

76. ALL DRIVERS MUST HAVE A VALID DRIVING LICENCE. No person without a valid driving licence shall drive a vehicle within the Showfield.
77. Only passengers over the age of 13 shall ride on vehicles and only on those with manufacturers provided passenger seating.
78. All Exhibitors must provide a valid Certificate of Motor Insurance for their vehicles or a Public Liability Insurance Certificate for any stationery engines.
79. Exhibits will only be accepted from exhibitors who complete an entry form along with a completed risk assessment (only one Risk Assessment required for an entry, not per vehicle) and relevant insurance certification for each vehicle.
80. One entry pass admits one vehicle and driver. Any additional passengers will have to pay the show day admit fee.
81. Entry to the show ground with a vehicle requires an official ADMIT pass (issued in advance). No access will be granted without prior entry and a valid ADMIT pass. All exhibits must be on site and stationary by 9.00am on Saturday 18th July 2026. Engines that are running must be supervised at all times by a responsible adult and never be left unattended.
82. JUDGING WILL COMMENCE AT 10.30am – JUDGE MAY NOT MAKE THEMSELVES KNOWN TO EXHIBITORS.

TRUCK FEST SECTION

83. ALL DRIVERS MUST HAVE A VALID DRIVING LICENCE. No person without a valid driving licence shall drive a vehicle within the Showfield.
84. No passengers permitted unless the vehicle is fitted with manufacturers provided passenger seating.
85. All Exhibitors must provide a valid Certificate of Motor Insurance for their vehicles or a Public Liability Insurance Certificate for any stationery engines.
86. Exhibits will only be accepted from exhibitors who have returned completed entry forms along with the completed risk assessment (only one Risk Assessment required for an entry, not per vehicle) and relevant insurance certification for each vehicle.

87. One pass admits one vehicle and driver. Note that the pass does not include additional passengers in the vehicle. Any additional passengers will have to pay the show day admit fee.

TRADE STANDS

90. All trade stands must be booked before the commencement of the Show.
91. The Show will be open from 9:00am to 7:00pm on Saturday and 10:00am to 5:00pm on Sunday. All stands must be set up by 8pm on the Friday. This is to ensure that all public attending the Friday night are safe from traffic and minimum congestion on Saturday morning when livestock will also be arriving. However, if you have a small stand which can be set up easily and quickly then you may set it up on Saturday morning – it must be set up by 9am. Standholders are required to remain on site until 6pm on the Sunday to allow sufficient time for the public to vacate the showground. Stand holders are NOT PERMITTED to trade out with the opening times of the Show.
92. No trade stand will be allowed to set up without first completing and signing a risk assessment and providing details of Public Liability Insurance.
93. No access to the Showpark will be granted without prior entry and a valid ADMIT pass
94. All stands or covered enclosures must be constructed or lined with flame-retardant material compliant with current fire safety standards New manufactured membranes and fabrics providing weatherproof coverings shall be of inherently flame-retardant fabric or durably flame retardant when tested to BS 5438.
95. Overnight Security will be in attendance over the weekend to ensure the safety of your stand from 9pm till 7am, the show committee will be around at other times.
96. All Stand Holders must co-operate with the organisers in compliance with Health and Safety Environmental Regulations and everything practicable must be done to ensure the health, safety and welfare of those attending. All stand holders must ensure they conduct themselves in a manner so that they do not put themselves or anyone else at risk.
97. All rubbish must be removed and taken away at the end of the event.

FOOD & CRAFT TENT

99. All Food & Craft stands must be booked before the commencement of the Show.
